Dear Residents and Families of Goderich Place,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued cooperation and patience during our recent outbreak.

It was with your help and cooperation as well as the assistance of everyone here at Goderich Place pulling together that we have managed to keep our community safe and healthy while paying special attention to their physical and emotional wellbeing.

I am extremely happy to announce that as of today, Friday, January 21, 2022 our outbreak has been deemed over. With this news we need to proceed with caution and continue to follow all Public Health advice and guidelines as we continue to navigate through these very challenging times. I would like to thank you for your support to continue to keep everyone safe and healthy.

We will continue to ask that all visits be done in resident suites only. Personal protective equipment including masks and eye protection is mandatory and must be worn at all times, including in resident suites. This means no eating or drinking when visiting with your loved ones. One of the reasons for ending up in isolation is not being diligent with masking and wearing goggles at all times.

We ask that only 2 guests visit with residents at any given time.

We will continue to actively screen all visitors, Visits will only be permitted if you pass active screening which includes proof of a negative antigen test and we ask that you are fully vaccinated if visiting on-site.

We ask that residents physical distance at least (6 feet apart) and wear mask, when anyone is in their suites, as well as when they are out of their suites. When residents are waiting in common areas and waiting for the dining area to be open they must maintain a safe distance from all other residents as well as wear mask until they are seated at their dining spot.

All activities in house will be kept to a minimum with physical distancing and masks to be worn at all times.

Residents will be provided with a medical mask for all types of absences. Residents must physical distance and use good hand hygiene while away from the home. Additionally, all residents on an absence, regardless for type or duration of the absence, must be actively screened upon their return to the home. Temporary (overnight) absences are not permitted at this time.
